Educational Purposes

- **Department of Regional Collaboration: Care and Welfare Course**

The Care and Welfare Course aims to train certified care workers who respect the daily lives of people requiring care, while possessing the specialized knowledge and skills necessary to support their independence.

- **Department of Regional Collaboration: Global Communication Course**

The Global Communication Course aims to develop individuals who can communicate with diverse groups of people using practical foreign language skills, acquiring the various abilities needed to thrive and contribute to the local community.

2. Eligibility for Application

Applicants with a nationality other than Japanese should understand our college admission policies, have a strong desire to study in the course of their choice, and satisfy following conditions:

- **Care and Welfare Course**

- (1) Those who meet, or are expected to meet, the eligibility requirements for university admission as stipulated by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT) of Japan.
- (2) Those who are recognized by the College as having academic ability equivalent to that of a high school or university graduate.
- (3) Those who do not hold Japanese nationality and are eligible to obtain a “Student” visa under the Immigration Control and Refugee Recognition Act (Cabinet Order No. 319 of 1951).
- (4) Those who are able to reliably pay tuition and living expenses from admission until graduation.
- (5) Those who have obtained one of the following Japanese language proficiency levels within the past two years:
 - Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) Level N3 or higher
 - At least 200 points in the “Japanese as a Foreign Language” section of the Examination for Japanese University Admission for International Students (EJU)
 - Level D or higher on the J.TEST (Test of Practical Japanese), or an equivalent level on one of the above exams.

●Global Communication Course

- (1) Those who meet, or are expected to meet, the eligibility requirements for university admission as stipulated by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT) of Japan.
- (2) Those who are recognized by the College as having academic ability equivalent to that of a high school or university graduate.
- (3) Those who do not hold Japanese nationality and are eligible to obtain a “Student” visa under the Immigration Control and Refugee Recognition Act (Cabinet Order No. 319 of 1951).
- (4) Those who are able to reliably cover all tuition and living expenses from admission through to graduation.

3. Selection method

- Applicants will be evaluated comprehensively based on a written examination in Japanese, an interview, and a review of submitted documents to assess their personality, Japanese language proficiency, and motivation to study.
- Applicants who, at the time of application, have obtained JLPT Level N1, scored 250 points or higher in the “Japanese as a Foreign Language” section of the EJU (Examination for Japanese University Admission for International Students), or obtained Pre-B level or higher on the J.TEST (Test of Practical Japanese) within the past two years will be required to submit an 800-character Japanese essay in place of the written examination.
- For applicants residing in Japan, the examination will be conducted on the date specified in Section 4. The exact time and venue will be notified after the application has been received.
 - ※ Please bring your passport on the day of the examination for identity verification.
- For applicants residing outside Japan, the date, time, and venue of the examination will be determined through coordination between the university and the applicant after the application is submitted, taking into account international circumstances.
 - ※ Depending on international circumstances, if a proctor cannot be dispatched locally, the written examination may be entrusted to a local partner institution, and the interview may be conducted online via the Web. Furthermore, if the number of applications exceeds expectations, the examination schedule may be adjusted or changed to ensure smooth operation.

5. Notes on Application Documents

- (1) Applications with incomplete or incorrect documents will not be accepted.
- (2) Submitted documents will not be returned. However, original documents that cannot be reissued—such as the original certificate of JLPT results—will be returned after enrollment or in the case of non-admission.
- (3) The entrance examination fee is non-refundable under any circumstances.
- (4) If any misconduct or falsification is discovered during the application process, admission may be revoked even after acceptance.
- (5) Applicants who require special considerations for taking the examination or pursuing their studies must consult the college before applying. Such consultation will not adversely affect the applicant's admission decision.

6. Documents to be submitted for application:

- (1) Application Form (designated format provided by the College)
 - Two ID photographs
(30mm × 40mm, taken within the last 3 months, upper body, no hat, plain background, clear image)
- One photo must be attached to the application form and one to the resume.
- (2) Resume and Statement of Purpose
(designated format provided by the College; a photo must be attached)
- (3) Original certificate of graduation from high school and the most recently attended school (e.g., university) (in Japanese or English) ※Note ①

- (4) Original Academic transcript from high school and the most recently attended school (e.g., university) (in Japanese or English) ※Note ②

Note ①②:

If the certificates are in a language other than Japanese or English, a Japanese or English translation must be attached. The translation must be certified by the issuing school, the embassy, or another public institution as matching the original. Translations certified by a Japanese language school or a licensed translation agency (corporate entity only) are also acceptable. However, all certificates must have been issued within 6 months of the submission date.

- (5) Certificate showing Attendance Rate and Academic Record, and Certificate of Graduation (or Expected Graduation) from an educational institution in Japan (for applicants residing in Japan)

- (6) Certificate of Japanese Language Study

- Must be issued by the institution where the applicant studied Japanese in their home country.
- The certificate must clearly state the duration of study and the total number of hours completed.

- (7) Application Fee: 10,000 yen

- Pay via bank transfer to the College's designated account (see Section 8: Admission Procedures) at the time of application, or pay in Japanese Yen (cash) on the day of the examination.

- (8) Original Score Reports for any of the following Japanese language proficiency tests taken within the past two years:

- Applicants who passed the JLPT (Japanese-Language Proficiency Test) administered by the Japan Educational Exchanges and Services (JEES) and the Japan Foundation must submit the original notification of results.
- Examinees of the EJU (Examination for Japanese University Admission for International Students) administered by JASSO, and the J.TEST (Test of Practical Japanese) administered by the Japan Language Testing Association, must submit their original score reports.

- (9) Income Declaration Form of Financial Supporter (designated format provided by the College)

- Submit photocopies of all pages of the bank passbook (including the cover) showing the deposit and withdrawal history of the financial supporter (applicant or relative), and the original Certificate of Bank Balance for that account.
- If a relative is paying the tuition, also submit the relative's original Certificate of Employment (or corporate registry if employment proof cannot be obtained), and an original notarized document proving the familial relationship between the applicant and the supporter.
※ If these documents are in a language other than Japanese or English, follow the same procedure as described in the note for (4) above.

- (10) Health Certificate (issued within the last 3 months; designated format provided by the College)

- (11) Certificate of Non-Active Tuberculosis (only for applicable countries/regions)

※The entrance fee will not be refunded for any reason if you later decline admission.



9. Tuition Exemption System

<Scholarship Student Type A: Tuition fee of 700,000 yen reduced by 80%>

Tuition Fee: 140,000 yen

(For those who meet the following requirements and are deemed appropriate by the College.)

At the time of application: Applicants who have obtained JLPT Level N1 within the past two years, or scored 250 points or higher in the “Japanese as a Foreign Language” section of the EJU, or achieved Pre-B level or higher on the J.TEST will be eligible for Scholarship A starting from the first year.

<Scholarship Student Type B: Tuition fee of 700,000 yen reduced by 50%>

Tuition Fee: 350,000 yen

(For those who meet the following requirements and are deemed appropriate by the College.)

At the time of application: Applicants who have obtained JLPT Level N2 within the past two years, or scored 200 points or more but less than 250 points in the “Japanese as a Foreign Language” section of the EJU, or achieved Level C on the J.TEST will be eligible for Scholarship B starting from the first year.

<Scholarship student Type C: Tuition fee of 700,000 yen reduced by 30%>

Tuition fee: 490,000 yen

(For those who meet the following requirements and are deemed appropriate by the College.)

At the time of application: Applicants who have obtained JLPT Level N3 within the past two years, or scored less than 200 points (including the written section) in the “Japanese as a Foreign Language” section of the EJU, or achieved Level D on the J.TEST, or obtained NAT-TEST Level 3 or higher will be eligible for Scholarship C starting from the first year.

Handling of the Scholarship System After Enrollment

- Students who meet the conditions below by the end of their first year of enrollment, submit a tuition reduction application, and are approved by the Faculty Council, will have the scholarship applied from their second year.

- The application period for the scholarship system is generally two years. However, it may be reviewed and subjected to a "downgrade" or "cancellation" through a "continuation review" based on academic performance, course registration status, etc.

10. Tuition Fees

- Tuition fees across the two years are as follows.

These include the entrance fee (paid once at time of admission), annual tuition fees, educational support fees (280,000 yen/year). These do not include training and textbook fees.

※However, if the primary household supporter’s annual income in the previous year is 5,000,000 yen or more, the scholarship amount will be the same as that for general students.

11. Training & Textbook fees

- The figures shown are based on the actual costs for the 2026 academic year (assuming all elective subjects are selected) and may be subject to change for the 2027 academic year. Additionally, textbook fees and other expenses may be required for each department.

12. Other expenses

- The rent for nearby apartments introduced by our college ranges from approximately 25,000 yen to 45,000 yen per room. Monthly utility expenses such as water, electricity, and gas are paid separately. Please note that an additional amount of about 400,000 yen is required as living expenses for 1 to 2 months.

(This includes security deposit, key money, agency fees, rent guarantee fees, and appliance costs, etc.)
