In Yamanashi, a wild-goose chase for ‘real Japan’

Minobu in Yamanashi **Prefecture**, famous for Kuon Temple, offers a **retreat** to tourists from the busy life of Tokyo.

Kuon Temple, founded in 1274, is the headquarters of the Nichiren sect of Buddhism near Mount Minobu. In the Edo Period, the town was lively with people, but today it is quieter, with **remnants** of its historic charm. The temple features Japan’s longest cable car in the Kanto region, though travelers can also hike up the mountain.

Junko Higuchi, a local business owner, left her high-paying Tokyo career to revitalize Minobu, **showcasing** local crafts like traditional washi paper-making. While such cultural experiences are **intriguing**, similar traditions exist in other areas, raising questions about Minobu’s claim as an example of the “real” Japan.

Recently at Kuon Temple, they discovered a wooden board that has handwriting from Nichiren himself. Despite the **skepticism**, the author recommends visiting Minobu for its special moments—a **monk**’s prayer at a roadside temple, the sight of Mount Fuji partially hidden by clouds, or to stay near the historic atmosphere of shukubō (temple lodgings).

Yoshitaka Suzuki, a **craftsman** at Minobusan University, works to balance preserving the past and creating new works. His approach tells a deeper truth: the search for authenticity might be less important than appreciating the experience. This **sentiment** encourages travelers to **let go of preconceived** ideas and **embrace** the beauty of what **unfolds**.

Japan's love affair with Dragon Quest spreads worldwide

Dragon Quest is one of Japan's most popular video games. The blue slime character appears in ads, and its music is played at concerts. The game is so loved that new releases happen on Saturdays to stop students from skipping school. Some stores have even been decorated like shops in the game.

Dragon Quest III (1988) introduced new features like an open-world map and a class system. A recent remake, Dragon Quest III HD-2D, updates the game with better graphics and music. Even after 35 years, the series is still very popular in Japan, and the new version has already sold over 2 million copies.

At first, Dragon Quest was not popular outside Japan. The first game, called "Dragon Warrior" in North America, was given away for free to help sales. Some games were not released overseas, and translations were difficult. Dragon Quest VII (2000) tried to reach Western players, but its huge story made translation hard.

The series became more popular worldwide with Dragon Quest VIII (2004) and Dragon Quest XI (2017), which sold over 7 million copies. The latest remake helps new fans enjoy the series, though some changes upset older players. With two creators passing away, the next game will be different, but Dragon Quest will continue to be loved.

Why tatami is going from the floor to the dining table

At Sushi Yatagarasu, a high-end sushi restaurant, diners receive not only a warm towel, chopsticks, and a wooden serving board but also a small tatami mat—for their smartphones! This new idea comes from the Isseki Sancho restaurant group, which wants to improve the dining experience for modern customers.

Tatami mats, traditionally used as flooring in Japanese-style rooms, are now appearing on tables. Kuboki Tatami Co. Ltd, a 300-year-old family business, makes these small tatami smartphone mats to protect expensive wooden counters from scratches and spills. Many high-end sushi restaurants, including Michelin-starred ones, have started using them.

Fumio Kuboki, the company's CEO, created the mats to save his struggling tatami business. Inspired by other traditional crafts adapting to modern needs, he began making tatami coasters and mats in 2019. Since then, over 100 restaurants in 28 countries, including the U.S. and France, have started using them.

In Japan, fine dining often focuses on counter seating, where chefs prepare food in front of customers like a performance. Many guests take photos or videos, making smartphones part of the dining experience. Restaurants like Sushi Satoru love the tatami mats because they protect counters and impress customers.

As technology and tradition blend, these small tatami mats are giving a centuries-old craft a new life!
